Outside of work, it's a similar story. I haven't seen some of my best mates for a while. I don't need to... I can text them. I upload snippets of my life on Facebook and Twitter and I catch up with them via their profiles. The shiny screens on my computer and phone are my gateway to the world.

And it's a safe world too. I don't have to speak to anyone. I can ignore the awkward silences and pauses. No one can tell if I'm in a bad mood and I don't have to deal with their moods either.

Brilliant.

Well, maybe not. Despite the benefits, life through a screen isn't all it's cracked up to be. Life is supposed to be about interruptions and interactions (and not of the retweet or 'FB Like' kind).

My real-life friends inconvenience me. They ask me to do stuff I don't really want to do. And that's the stuff that builds friendships. I've never bonded with anyone over a status update, but I have through a gig, a party or simply having a chat over a cuppa.
